REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION April 15, 2024

I. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Hale Area Schools Board of Education was called to order by President Spaw at 6:00 pm

- V. Student Recognition: Student names and achievements were read aloud by Mr. Yorke, while Mr. Bowman handed out certificates of recognition, and paused for photos.
- VI. Guest Comments Members of the public may address the board at this time: None

VII. Reports to the Board

- A. Principal's Report Mr. Bowman updated the Board on the status & timeline of staff observations & final evaluations; he highlighted upcoming events, including prom, Academic Excellence, & incentive & senior trips, and gave details of the recent painting fundraiser. Next year's scheduling will include summer school considerations for 6-12.
- **B.** Business Manager's Report Mr. Boensch provided a review of financial information, and an update that wood chips for the playground will be put in this week. He also provided some background information pertaining to the IRC Section 127 Plan.
- C. Superintendent's Report Mr Yorke gave information on recent and upcoming events including a presentation from Trooper Noble this Thursday, Kindergarten roundup, and a flagpole for outside athletic playing fields. He provided a culvert update, and reviewed the recent meeting with Mr. Lewis regarding child-care project concerns, the blight grant, walking trail, and parking lot seal coating at Eagle Pointe. Mr. Yorke indicated that he will try to meet with Mr. Lewis monthly.
- **D.** MiCIP Team Report Mrs. Blomquist and Mrs. Shellenbarger provided a recap of the recent ELA Reading Month activities including a family night featuring board games, World of Music Assembly, and Readers are Leaders Magic Show, with the story book parade wrapping up the week. The next two Tuesdays are MiCIP meetings, where the focus will be digging into perception data.

A. Consent Agenda

At the recommendation of Mr. Yorke, a motion was made by Shellenbarger, supported by Sheldon, to accept the consent agenda dated April 15, 2024 as presented.

B. NEOLA Policy Update - First Reading

At the recommendation of Mr. Yorke, a motion was made by Shellenbarger, supported by Olmstead to consider as first reading, the policy updates of <u>Vol.38</u>, <u>No.2</u> including: 1240, 2410(rescind), 2414, 2418, 3220, 6320, 6321, 6325 6350, 6520, 8390. 8800, as well as 0122, 1420, 3131, 3142, 3220, from the November 2023 Special Update, not previously adopted. Discussion occurred. **Roll call:** 6 yes, 0 no, 1 absent; motion carried

C. Sinking Fund Millage Proposal

At the recommendation of Mr. Yorke, a motion was made by Spaw, supported by Cryderman to accept the Sinking Fund Millage proposal language as outlined, which would authorize the levy of an additional 2 mills over a period of five years (2025-2029) if approved. Discussion occurred; full resolution language read aloud and attached **Roll call:** 6 yes, 0 no, 1 absent; motion carried

D. IRC Section 127 Educational Assistance Plan Resolution

At the recommendation of Mr. Yorke, a motion was made by Sheldon, supported by Olmstead to approve the IRC, Section 127 Educational Assistance Plan as detailed, and to direct business office personnel to undertake all actions necessary to implement and administer the plan. **Roll call:** 6 yes, 0 no, 1 absent; motion carried

E. Memo of Understanding with HFT

At the recommendation of Mr. Yorke, a motion was made by Shellenbarger, supported by Spaw to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with the Hale Federation of Teachers regarding the Retirement Prep Plan. Roll call: 6 yes, 0 no, 1 absent; motion carried

- A. Sinking Fund Project Prioritization listing reviewed & discussed.
- **B.** Walking Path discussion occurred relating to past history; all members agreed we would be open to further discussion/information/proposal concerning not only the walking path, but also child-care and blight concerns from Mr. Yorke's report; there was not support indicated for the seal-coating of Eagle Pointe Plaza, however.
- X. Board Comments Lynch commented on the upcoming PTO Glow Dance Friday, April 26. Sheldon stated her appreciation for Mr. Blomquist; Cryderman echoed this sentiment, and neither can imagine our school without him. Olmstead commented on the baseball fundraiser; he also invited attendance at the Parks & Recreation meetings that take place on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm. Spaw commented on fall football, and further discussion occurred around season planning; Shellenbarger had no comment.

A regular meeting of the board of education of the District (the "Board") was held in the <u>Hale Area Schools Library</u>, within the boundaries of the District, on the 15th day of April, 2024, at <u>Six</u> o'clock in the <u>p.m.</u> (the "Meeting").

The Meeting was called to order by Jeremy Spaw, President.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member <u>Spaw</u> and supported by Member <u>Cryderman</u>:

WHEREAS:

- 1. This Board intends to submit a proposition at a special election to be held on Tuesday, August 6, 2024.
- 2. On or before 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 14, 2024, the Board shall certify any ballot proposition to be submitted to the voters at such election to the election coordinator or coordinators designated to conduct elections within the District (the "Election Coordinator").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. A special election of the school electors of the District be called and held on Tuesday, August 6, 2024.
- 2. The proposition to be voted on at the special election shall be stated on the ballots in substantially the form as set forth in Exhibit A.
 - 3. The Election Coordinator is requested to:
 - a. Utilize <u>Iosco County Herald</u>, a newspaper published or of general circulation within the District, for publication of notices in accordance with the election law requirements.
 - b. Utilize ballot proposition summary information, as prepared by legal counsel, in the forms of the notices of last day of registration and election in substantially the form as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto.
 - c. Provide a proof copy of the ballot to the District and its legal counsel in sufficient time to allow the ballot to be proofread prior to printing.
- 4. The Secretary of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of this resolution with the Election Coordinator and with any Election Clerk or clerks designated to conduct elections within the District by 4:00 p.m., on Tuesday, May 14, 2024.

EXHIBIT A

HALE AREA SCHOOLS SINKING FUND MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Hale Area Schools, Iosco and Ogemaw Counties, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed 2.00 mills (\$2.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 (five) years, 2025 to 2029, inclusive, to create a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate for sites for, and the construction or repair of, school buildings; for school security improvements; for the acquisition or upgrading of technology; for the acquisition of student transportation vehicles; for the acquisition of parts, supplies, and equipment used for the maintenance of student transportation vehicles; for the acquisition of eligible trucks and vans used to carry parts, equipment, and personnel for or in the maintenance of school buildings; for the acquisition of parts, supplies, and equipment used to maintain such trucks and vans; and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2025 is approximately \$799,597?
